Today, Rush is an author, and she has a master's degree in professional psychology.

Among BTWEN's extremely talented Board of Directors is Ron Abernathy, the nephew of the great civil rights leader, Ralph Abernathy. Abernathy was a champion of human rights in the 20th century, and Washington was a champion of human relations in the late 1800s, and early 1900s. What a great merging of minds evolving through their direct descendants in the 21st century.

Espousing the teachings of Booker T. Washington on education, leadership, excellence, personal responsibility, and character building, BTWEN seeks to help disadvantaged youth and their families rise above difficult circumstances—empowering them to discover their own extraordinary legacies, and return to their communities creating positive change as leaders, mentors, and role models.

Future Plans

Joining hundreds of organizations around the nation named after Booker T. Rush says the invitation to the Inauguration is special not only because of the historical significance — but it also signifies how far not just African-Americans, but all Americans have come — from her great-grandfather's invitation as a guest in the White House, which caused tremendous uproar, to Obama's acceptance to become the honored host. Upon her return home she intends to be fully energized — ready to march full speed ahead on BTWEN's mission to help America prosper.
